

### Elder Board Update

#### A NEW ELDER JOINS THE BOARD

Much like a traditional for-profit business has a Board of Directors, New Denver Church is guided by a board of elders responsible for overseeing big-picture decisions. Often referred to as "NDC's guardrails," this five-person team—led by Norton Herbst—meets monthly to discuss key matters ranging from the church's building lease to the approval of major projects and expenses. While most churches have a governing body such as an elder board, each church structures and approaches it differently. At NDC, we invite one new member to join the board each year following a written application and an interview with the current elders. Each member serves a three-year term, which means that every year one person joins the board while another completes their service and rotates off.

This year, we invite Lindsay Cooper to join the elder board while Jennifer Coggins has completed her three-year term and rotates off. Lindsay and Pete Cooper have been at NDC for over three years and have jumped into community at NDC with enthusiam and faithfulness. You might know Lindsay from Host Team on Sunday mornings, or leading Prayer Downstairs every 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month. Maybe you know her from MomCo or from any of the D-Groups she and Pete have led.

Lindsay brings with her gifts of leadership, generosity, and prayer. If you know her in any capacity, you know that the Spirit works through her on a regular basis in all these ways. We will more formally commission Lindsay in this new role during service sometime this summer, in the meantime, check out her Rapid Fire responses below!
