

Straw or Gold? Exploring James Over Twelve Weeks

For the next three months, we're going to explore the New Testament letter of James together. This book is fascinating for a bunch of reasons:

- + It is likely the earliest writing of the New Testament: before any of the gospel accounts of Jesus' life, before any of Paul's letters. When we read this letter, we're getting the earliest recorded thoughts on what it meant to be a follower of Jesus.
- + It is most likely written by the half-brother of Jesus himself. James was a biological son of Joseph and Mary. He grew up with Jesus. And, when Jesus started teaching and calling followers to himself, James was *not a fan*. But later, his whole perspective changed when Jesus rose from the dead.
- + Martin Luther, who helped launch the Protestant Reformation, actually scorned the book of James. He famously called it a "letter of straw." He didn't think it stood up to Paul's letters. We'll explore why.
- + Finally, the famous Camino de Santiago—a pilgrimage pathway in Spain—has made James quite popular today (Santiago is "Saint James" in Spanish). It is believed that James' bones are buried in Spain, and pilgrims began to travel to see them in the 9th century. Several NDCers have recently walked the Camino.

I hope you'll prioritize joining us on Sundays and be open to what God might show you and teach you through this extraordinary book.
