Better Stories: A Lenten Series

Football coaches are funny. They often say to their team before every game: "This is the most important game of the season!" Never mind that Coach said the same thing last week and the week before that and the week before that. This time, he really does mean it.

Have you noticed I often do this with sermon series? Pretty regularly, you hear me say something like this: "Next Sunday, we're kicking off a new sermon series and it's one of the most important series we've ever done!"

And I truly mean it. Whether it's something more creative, or more practical, or a good ole-fashioned, dive-into-the-Bible kind of series, I always believe in the potential for God to use a sermon series in a powerful way. When we give our attention to one idea over the course of several weeks or months, sometimes God stirs things up that actually transform the way we think, believe, and live. That's my hope at least.

Soooo, I say all of that because here we go again. For this season of Lent, we're kicking off a new sermon series and I truly believe it's one of the most important series we've ever done!

Put very simply: we're going to ask one extremely consequential question. It's a question at the heart of what it means to follow Jesus. It's a question that has often been answered poorly or incompletely or sometimes just wrongly.

And, it's a question that, if you answer it or it was answered for you poorly, will send you in a slightly wrong direction when it comes to everything you believe about God and yourself, that will, over years, take you farther and farther away from who he really is and who you really are. And my hunch is that a lot of us (maybe most of us) have had this experience. We're much farther away from understanding God and our true selves than we realize and we need to go back to this foundational question and rethink it.

That's what I'm going to try to help us do for seven weeks. Which is why: This upcoming sermon series is one of the most important series we've ever done!

We'll kick it off on February 15.
